



## HLTFA402B Apply Advanced First Aid

The purpose of the Course in Apply Advanced First Aid is to provide participants with the skills and knowledge to provide advanced first aid response, life support, management of casualty(s), the incident and other first aiders, until the arrival of medical or other assistance, and provision of support to other providers.

Entry requirements: Nil

Pre & Co-requisites: HLTFA301B Apply First Aid *(CPR certification must be within 12 months of completion)*

Duration: 20 hours  
*(if certification for the above 'Pre & Co-requisite' is present and current)*

Venue: This program can be conducted at your location of business or at a venue that is suitable and convenient to the participants. First Intervention is able to deliver this course at a time to suit your needs

Class Size: Normally a minimum of eight (8) participants is required and a maximum of 20 participants is allowed.

Content:

- The Chain of Survival
- Infection control
- Legal Responsibilities
- Trauma management
- OH&S requirements
- Spinal Care
- Management of a First Aid Facility
- Basic Anatomy, Physiology & Toxicology
- MSDS
- Patient Assessment & Management
- Airway Management
- Incident Reports & Records
- Operation of Resuscitation Equipment and pressurised gases
- Incident Coordination and Evaluation
- Ongoing Monitor and Management of casualties

Evaluation: Competency is assessed during the course by way of practical demonstration of skills and In class activities both written and practical as well a series of Multiple Choice Questionnaires. The learner will be required to complete a pre-course workbook from support notes provided. All sections must be completed and passed to competency level to qualify for issue of the Certification.

Certificates: On successful completion of this course participants are awarded a Course in Apply Advanced First Aid Statement of Attainment. This certification is valid for a period of 3 years from the date of issue. It is recommended that CPR and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (Oxygen and Defibrillation) be updated every 12 months.
